Mum became ill and was told by her doctor that she could no longer travel. Even though Mum was told about her illness, she was very determined to travel back to the place she called home, Ernabella.

In the last year, Mum became well aware of her health condition. During these times, it was confusing, stressful and demanding to all who cared, supported and loved Mum throughout her time of illness.

Mum then went into Flinder's House in Quorn for respite care on 17 May 2001. It took her quite a while to settle in; but she was still happy and smiling, being her old true self, in which everybody knew her as.

Mum was a proud Anangu woman, proud of her Aboriginality, proud to be a Colebrook sister, and extremely proud of her family for whom her love was cherished.

EUOLOGY

Nguntju (mum) was born at Ernabella Community where she was taken away as a child from her mother and was placed at Colebrook Home, Eden Hills, Adelaide.

Mum grew up at Eden Hills with her other Colebrook brothers and sisters, also becoming very attached to Sister Rutter and Sister Hyde, the two sisters who looked after her. Mum attended Eden Hills School, and after completing her schooling in Adelaide, she went to Alice Springs where she met her loving husband, Charles Ah Chee (Deceased).

Mum worked at the Alice Springs Hospital and also at Pine Gap. Mum played sport for the Inlander, and Pioneers Hockey Teams and she was an excellent sportswoman.

Mum and Dad had eight lovely children who also loved to play their sports. In 1972, Mum and Dad moved from Alice Springs back to Port Augusta where Dad was employed to work on the Railways.

They moved to Quorn in 1975 where they bought a house. When Dad passed away Mum moved back to Ernabella (Pukatja) to be with her families; she was very happy to see her families of the Anangu Pitjantjatjara lands once again. Mum stayed at Ernabella and travelled throughout the AP lands a lot, going to her Meetings and visiting different communities and catching up with other relatives that she hadn't seen for quite some time.

On 03 March 1993, Mum was advised by the doctor at the Ernabella Health Clinic to move back to Quorn. Mum was staying at Colebrook Home but she still travelled up and down to Ernabella with Aunty Clara Coulthard. When we heard that Mum and Aunty Clara were on the move, we would say, "The Leyland Sisters are off again", as we would laugh. Mum and Aunty Clara were affectionately known as the "Leyland Sisters". This was the name given by Uncle Bruce Fielding (Deceased).
