Josie was a bright, lovely baby girl who her parents really loved and was so proud of her, all her family loved her too, she was a very good girl, always happy.

When they travelled on the train they would make her bed inside of the lid of the suitcase, she would have a good sleep as the train rocked her to sleep.

As Josie grew up during her school days she met a lot of friends and more families, she had a personality of a happy-go lucky girl, who was so friendly, funny, always joking, teasing and laughing and making others happy with her big cheesy smiles. She loved her two brothers Bradley and Troy and sister Barla and her cousin sisters and brothers so much, they would always hang out together and have fun, there was not a dull moment.
