Do thy friends despise, forsake thee?

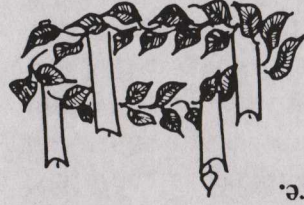
